On-Line Lectures and Workshops

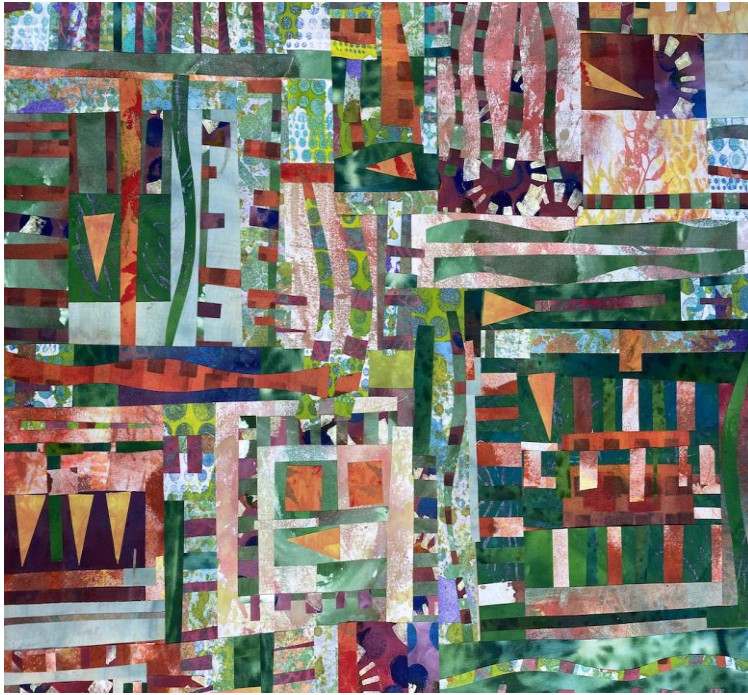

First step is to make the leaves out of nylon organza snippet and then stitch them in a nice form in free embroidery. Then they will be zapped with an embossing tool, as you want them to look like.

Just wait and see! This is a lot of fun and you will also be able to make a lot of other shapes, for example mussels, trees...

We will also learn how to make nice stitched strings out of wire or wool and how to create a nice background for our leaves.



List of supplies:

- 50 / 50 cm polyester organza in an autumn color
- scraps of polyester organza
- if you have some bits of lurex or other shiny 100% polyester Fabric
- ca. 30 x 30cm Fabric of felt in matching color and batting
- A little bit (30 cm) of wool or thick cotton in green or brown or whatever you have
- Pins
- Scissors for paper and for fabric. 1 small scissors
- Machine embroidery thread in machine color and thread for the bottom
- Embroidery threads in the same color. Quilting needle.
- 1 Cork board, size 20 x 30 cm, at least 1 cm thick or use your Iron board with a backing sheet
- 1 embossing tool
- A marking pen (Frixion for example)
